1 Publication & Academic Dissemination

- Published in the *The Lancet*. Support uptake:

4 Health Information Systems & Care Integration

- Embed new terminology into:
- Electronic Health Records (EHRs)
 - SNOMED CT terminology

- Engage:
- Major EMR vendors
 - Universities & training programs
 - Textbook publishers

2 Resource Development

Co-design patient and health professional resources. Ensure:

- Multiple languages
- Diverse formats (print, digital, multimedia)
- Accessibility across care settings

3 Global Communication & Engagement

Deliver a structured global communication strategy, including:

- Society toolkits
- Multilingual patient and clinician resources
- Multimedia campaigns
- Professional education programs
- International patient and health professional events



5 Policy & Research Alignment

- Partner with:
 - Governments and regulators
 - Research funding bodies
 - Journal editors and publishers
 - Industry stakeholders

- Align terminology across:
- Research classification systems
 - Publications and funding processes



6 International Classification & Global Bodies

Formal engagement with:

- World Health Organization (WHO)
- Other international health agencies

Progress inclusion in:

- International Classification of Diseases (ICD)



7 Transition & Future Refinement

- Implement a 3-year managed transition period

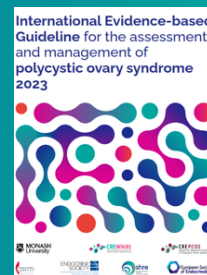
Activities include:

8 Guideline Integration

- Embed the new name into the International 2028 PCOS Guideline
 - Guideline used in 195 countries
